What are 3 preventative measures to avoid hyperthermia?

Ans. Limit strenuouus riding to late evenings or early mornings when the temperature is cooler. At shows keep horses in the shade as much as possible, unsaddle horses completely between classes if time allows. Use fans in barns or stalls, provide shade for outside horses. Clip horses with long hair, transport horses during cool times of the day and be provided adequate ventilation, provide plenty clean fresh water.
