ECOLOGY

Beach Ecology - Studying beach changes through erosion and deposition

Forest Ecology - Understanding interdependency and life cycles in forest ecosystems

Lake Ecology - Understanding the characteristics of lakes and lake organisms

LIVING HISTORY

Pioneer Life - Investigating early pioneer daily life, culture, and associated skills

Native American Skills - Absorbing the skills and culture that were integral to Native American life

Gold Panning - Introducing the early history of Georgia and the role of gold in the relations between Native Americans and colonists

OUTDOOR SKILLS

Canoeing - Understanding canoeing techniques, water safety, and procedures

Orienteering - Exploring basic orienteering skills like orienting a compass and pacing

Survival Skills - Learning skills and techniques essential for subsistence in the wild

TEAM BUILDING

Challenge Course - Focusing on the principles of teamwork by progressing through team-based activities

New Games - Enabling students to increase physical skills, trust, and cooperation within a group using non-traditional activities

Team Initiatives - Using teamwork to set goals, solve problems, and build trust
