Purdue University Extension is pleased to provide this report of the 12th year of Military Teen Adventure Camps from the Summer, 2022! Funded by a partnership between the Department of Defense, Military Community and Family Policy, Office of Military Family Readiness Policy, Children, Youth, and Families, and the United States Department of Agriculture (National Institute of Food and Agriculture), teens (age 13-18) with connections to active duty, guard, reserve, and retired military personnel enjoyed high energy, high experience camps in locations across the United States of America.
