- 2. Chair 2: When comparing the absorbency of types of bedding, which of the following would be most absorbent? Shredded newspaper, straw, or pinewood sawdust?
  - A: Shredded Newspaper (HIH 350-2)
- 3. Chair 3: What is the term for a bony enlargement around the bones of the pastern?
  - A: Ringbone (HIH 230-3)
- 4. Chair 4: What kind of hitch is described by two pairs with one in front of the other?
  - A: A four-in-hand hitch (DET 114)
- 5. Chair 1: The first estrus period shortly after foaling is called what?
  - A: Foal Heat (DET 111)
- 6. Chair 2: Name the term for the vessel that delivers deoxygenated blood to the heart.
  - A: Vein (ES-208)
