Archaeology: the scientific study of historic or prehistoric peoples and cultures by

analysis of artifacts and other such remains, especially those that

have been excavated

Artifacts: objects that are made or modified by humans. Examples are

arrowheads, baskets, pottery, stone tools and glass or metal objects

Effigy: a representation of a person, animal or object especially in the form

of sculpture

Excavation: method of exposing past cultures and artifacts by systematically

removing layers of soil

Historic: dating from or preserved from a past time or culture; well-known or

important in history

Prehistoric: referring to times before written history

Mound: a raised platform made from piled soil, stone or other material

Quartz: a hard, glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form

Woodland Period: time period of 1,000 BCE - 800 CE during which native peoples in

North America created more permanent settlements, started

cultivation of gardens (though they were still reliant on hunting and

gathering), began trading, and developed important inventions

including the bow and arrow, pottery, and copper tools
