Blacksmithing: the art of manipulating metal using heat and pressure to create tools

Brace and Bit: a hand tool used to drill holes in wood

Drawknife: a traditional woodworking hand tool used to shape wood by

removing shavings

Froe and Maul: a set of tools for cleaving wood by splitting it along the grain. The

froe is a straight, metal blade which is struck with the maul, a piece

of hardwood shaped similar to a hammer and club

Mechanical the ratio of force exerted by a machine to the force applied to it; in

Pioneer: (noun) a person who is among those who first enter or settle a

region, thus opening it for occupation and development by others (adjective) being the earliest, original, first of a particular kind

Shaving Horse: traditional woodworking tool used to hold a piece of wood in place

while it is worked by a cutting tool such as a drawknife or spokeshave

Simple Machine: a device that alters the magnitude or direction of a force; examples

include the lever, pulley, wheel and axle, screw, wedge, and inclined

plane

Slave: someone who is the legal property of another person; most slaves in

labor for crop production
