



Orienteering Vocabulary

Base Plate: square plate that the dial sits on, also contains a ruler on the sides

and the direction of travel arrow

Bearing: direction, measured from one position to another using geographical

reference lines

Compass: instrument used to determine geographic direction of travel

Dial: part of the compass which rotates to align degrees with directional

arrow; usually filled with water and marked with numbers

representing the degrees

Direction-of-travel: arrow on base plate pointing to your destination

GPS: global positioning system that uses radio navigation to find your

exact location

Map: a representation of land showing geography, cities, roads, and other

features

Needle: magnetized arrow inside compass dial, which always points to north

and south

Pacing: system of counting every other step to measure the distance traveled

Orienteering: the act or sport of someone using a map and compass to find points

in a landscape

Topographic Maps: graphic representation of the surface features of a place or region on

a map, indicating positions and elevations their relative
