





## 4-H Tidelands Homeschool Schedule Spring 2021 Field Trip Fridays

At the 4-H Tidelands Nature Center we encourage learning by doing. Our enthusiastic educators encourage excitement and wonder of the natural world. Jekyll's pristine natural environment is the perfect setting for a one of a kind educational experience. Our Homeschool Days are open to all school age students. Programs held **every other Friday in April**. Programs run from **10:30am-12:00pm** and are **\$10** per person (children AND adults). Students can participate in a single day or sign up for multiple programs. We accept cash or check.

Classes are conducted rain or shine so please make sure your students are dressed appropriately for the outdoors. At least one parent should attend class with your child/children (or make arrangements for another parent who is also attending to be responsible for your child). **COVID-19 GUIDELINES:** Please bring a face mask because all guests must wear one during the majority of the program and inside the nature center. Social distancing will be required between separate families and staff. To allow for extra space between participants, we will be limiting the number of participants for each of the programs. If you are feeling ill or have a temperature, please do not attend one of our programs. Tidelands has incorporated extra cleaning procedures within the nature center and has hand sanitizer and surface disinfecting wipes available as well as disposable gloves upon request.

April 2<sup>nd</sup> -Jekyll Island Birding Safari — Join us on a safari of Jekyll Island using binoculars to identify birds. We will learn how to use a field guide and binoculars as we visit birding hot-spots around the island. Learn about bird adaptations and behaviors. Binoculars provided.

April 16<sup>th</sup> – Dock Study Explore the salt-pond adjacent to Tidelands Nature Center. Use dips nets to find animals and plants in pond. Learn about fouling communities and animal life styles.

April 30<sup>th</sup> - **Seining**- Come pull a seine net through the water and try to catch fish, shrimp, crabs and other organisms found in the ocean. Please wear shoes and clothing that can get wet. (We will pull the seine net in ankle- deep water along the beach).
