

Salt Marsh Ecology Vocabulary

Brackish:	A mixture of freshwater and saltwater
Detritus:	Decaying organic plant and animal matter
Filter Feeding:	Method in which food particles are filtered from the water as it passes by or through some part of the organism
Marsh:	An area of low-lying land covered by water during wet seasons or high tide
Neap Tide:	A tide just after the first or third quarters of the moon when there is least difference between high and low water
Phytoplankton:	Plant-like plankton consisting of microscopic plants
Plankton:	Floater or drifter; Organisms floating in the sea or fresh bodies of water unable to swim against a current
Salinity:	The amount of salt dissolved in water. Measured in parts per thousand
Spring Tide:	A tide just after a new or full moon, when there is the greatest difference between high and low tide
Tide:	The alternate rising and falling of bodies of water due to the gravitational pull of the moon
